HEALTH CERTIFICATES

Health certificates are available for interstate and overseas travel. Health certificates are required for all animals shipped by government or commercial transportation.

Certificates are valid for ten days only. Therefore, appointments should not be made until the definite date of the animal's shipment is known. Contact the clinic at least 45 days prior to shipment of foreign countries for vaccination and entry requirements.

PRESCRIPTIONS

Refilled only when prescribed by the military veterinarian in the medical record. A record must be maintained reflecting the problem requiring the medication.

Registration

State law and CBC Instruction 5510.2M requires the immunization of dogs and cats over 4 months of age against rabies. All pets living on base must be registered with this clinic and the housing office.

Proof of rabies immunization is required at time of registration. If we did not vaccinate your animals, bring the certificate of rabies vaccination to the facility for registration and records updating.

VACCINES

Rabies

Rabies is given at 16 weeks of age as required by California law. The first vaccination is good for a year and every third year after.

FVRCP (Felines)

The FVRCP vaccine includes Rhinotracheitis, Calici, Panleukopenia, Chlamydia, and Psittaci. The vaccine is given at 8 weeks, 12 weeks and 16 weeks of age, followed by an annual booster. All cats receiving their first FVRCP should receive another within 3 to 4 weeks regardless of age.

FELV

The Feline Leukemia vaccine is given in a series of 3 vaccinations at 9 weeks, 12 weeks, 2 to 4 months after the second, and followed by an annual booster.

Bordetella (Kennel Cough)

The Bordetella vaccine is given at least 2 weeks before grooming, boarding or socializing (dog park).

DA2P (Distemper, Adenovirus, Parvo)

The DA2P vaccine is given at 8 weeks, 12 weeks and 16 weeks of age, followed by an annual booster. All dogs receiving their first DA2P should receive another within 3 to 4 weeks regardless of age.

There will be a first time wellness exam fee with the vet for \$25

LAB TESTING

Fecal Exam

We recommend a yearly stool check on all dogs and cats to ensure your pet is not harboring any intestinal tract parasites. Puppies and kittens are routinely dewormed. A fecal should be submitted on all animals experiencing loose stools or weight loss. Samples may be brought to the clinic during normal business hours.

Heartworm Testing

Heartworms live in the hearts and lungs of dogs, and are spread by mosquitoes. Dogs infected with heartworms will not show signs until late in the disease. We recommend that all dogs stay on a preventative all year. Yearly heartworm checks are strongly suggested for dogs not on preventative. Dogs on preventative will be tested annually.

SPECIAL NOTES

Cats must be in carriers and dogs on a leash when brought into the clinic.

Kindly give the veterinary clinic at least a 24-hour notice if you need to cancel your appointment.

The clinic does not offer emergency services, so please contact a civilian veterinarian off base for emergencies or after hours emergency services in Arroyo Grande.

It is the owner's responsibility to restrain their animals at all times while in the facility. All animals must be on a leash or in a carrier, and owners are required to clean up after their pets while in the clinic or surrounding area.

CLIENT RESPONSIBILITIES

For safety reasons all young children must be supervised at all times, to avoid any unwanted bites and or scratches from any sick pets waiting in our lobby.

OFF BASE REFERRALS

A list of off base Veterinarians, Boarding and Grooming facilities are available at the Veterinary Clinic. Although we are not allowed to recommend any off base veterinarians, boarding or grooming facility, we will provide these local area listings for your convenience.
